Greetings from Cambodia!!

It's wonderful here! The weather is fantastical. Our host and hostess are obviously very hospitable and likeable! Friday morning we attended chapel with Ronda (Rich had language school). We got to see the school and informally meet the students. After Rich got home, we headed to Siem Reap, which is a 5-6 hour drive. Its only 180 miles, but due to road conditions, traffic, cows, etc., it takes much longer than you would expect. The drive was beautiful, rice patties and simple living. It looked very similar to any other developing country outside the city, wooden/tin roof houses, free-roaming livestock and poultry. The thing to do in Siem Reap is explore the temples. We also went to visit the Khmer Rouge Genocide museum. What an eye-opener. After reading through all the history and what resulted in those few years, my appreciation for the Cambodians grew substantially. Based on their history, you could easily expect their disposition to be like Russians/Ukrainians...don't smile, don't trust, don't befriend. The Khmer people are the complete opposite, they are a friendly, welcoming and trusting people with a recent history (1975-1979) of mass murders, despair and destruction. The amount of resolve they have as a people and a country is incredible. Its great to be in a tropical climate, greater to catch up with the Dolans, but greater still to see the work of God first-hand and put all the faces with the names of the stories we've heard about the students and how they are following God's will despite the fact that it was nothing they had ever heard even just a couple of years ago. There is much to learn from them.
