SETTING BOUNDARIES ANDREW LEMUS JANUARY 14, 2024

People say a lot of things, and often times when I hear "they say" I roll my eyes and wonder who "they" are. One thing I have heard a lot of people say is that kids actually thrive when they have rules and that without them, they are insecure, fearful, and confused. So while I, probably along with a lot of you, have heard this said, I thought it would be a good idea to go do my own research to see what the Bible says about this topic.

Rules Expose Sin. Like Adam and Eve in the Garden, we are created in the image of God without spot or blemish, and unfortunately, like them, we eventually choose to violate God's will. While in the perfect world we would feel the sting of sin as it violates the conscience we have been blessed with, repent, and plead for forgiveness and reconciliation with God. Sadly, we often repeat the action, further separate ourselves from God, and grow callous to the sinful practices we have grown accustomed (1John 1:6). Paul writes to Timothy that the law wasn't given to those who are good, pure, and holy, but to the lawless, disobedient, ungodly, unholy, profane, and sinners (1Tim. 1:8-10). Where the will of God is proclaimed, it exposes the listeners to their state and condition. Hopefully this recognition motivates repentance and reconciliation with God. Why the law then? It shows us where we are making mistakes and reveals our need for a redeemer.

How can this help with children? Sadly, our children follow in our footsteps as well as every human that has come before us minus one. The law can show them their faults, errors, and inappropriate actions which hopefully will bring about a heart of remorse, repentance, and redemption. You probably are not going to like what I am about to say, but lovingly teach (Eph. 4:17-15; 1Cor. 13:4-8) your children the law so that they can see vividly how sinful, guilty, and lost they are, with the goal and hope that they will seek counsel, guidance, instruction, forgiveness, and redemption from their God (Romans 3:9-31).

Rules Bring Life. It is within the boundaries of God's reign that we as human beings can flourish, grow, and be transformed into the vessel that God has created us to be (2Tim. 3:16-17). We have been created for a purpose and it is to live in harmony with God, experience God, and glorify God for eternity. Like the branch connected to the vine, with the vine dresser pruning for growth, so it is with us as we abide within the boundaries, reign, and kingdom of God (John 15:1-10). It is within God's boundaries and rule that we find life, peace, growth, and joy (Ezekiel 47:1-12).

How can this help with children? You can actually see it on their faces, in their steps, and in their smiles. The peace, joy, and life manifested by a child residing within the boundaries of God's kingdom are evident. Is your child a life giver? Ok, before you go do something crazy because you have kids that are in an age of transformation, please understand that the responsibility given to us parents to raise our children in the admonition of the Lord is something we are all struggling with as parents (Deuteronomy 6:4-9). It's hard! That being said, we shouldn't let the sacrifice, service, instruction, longsuffering, patience, persevere...ok, you got the picture, stop you from serving your purpose under God's reign as a parent. When we establish our children within the will of God it does and will bring about success, joy, and contentment in life.

What "they" say is true biblically. Setting boundaries, rules, and laws around your children not only protects them from the hardships, challenges, pain, and suffering ungodly behavior brings, but it can bring about a recognition of their sin problem, reconciliation to their God, and the life He provides to those that abide in His kingdom. I get it, keeping the boundaries of God in place in our households can be challenging, and disciplining our kids for violating them even more, but the life that will be gained by their obedience to the Father will be well worth it in the end.
