As we begin this new year of 2024, I am reminded of a thought I shared with you on March 19, 2017. I've decided to revisit this article as the most beneficial of New Year's resolutions, to renew and deepen our communication and relationship with our Father, Lord, and God.

We all struggle sometimes to feel connected to God. At one time or another, most of us have probably wondered, "Why is it so difficult to hear the voice of God?"

First, a word on encouragement, Don't Worry! God is constantly communicating to us even when it feels like we can't hear him. This is not just feel-good talk. God doesn't abandon His kids. He is speaking.

Then why does it sometimes feel like we can't hear Him? Maybe it is because we forget or overlook how God speaks to us . . . what His voice sounds like.

Psalm 119:105 NLT says, "Your Word is a lamp to guide my feet and a light for my path." When the writer is talking about God's Word here, he is talking about the Scriptures, the Bible, God's Holy Word. Scripture is the way by which God talks to each of us. So, if you are feeling lost—like God's not speaking to you—go to the Bible. He is speaking to you right now in those pages. And what if just for one day, we called the Bible "God's Voice" instead of "God's Word" just as a vivid reminder that the Bible is where God speaks to us every day!

Of course, the Bible can be an intimidating book. Where should we start? Well, try the gospels (Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John). The story of Jesus' physical life on earth is found in these four books. Check out reading plans online or talk to one of the elders, deacons, ministers, or your Christian mentor. There are lots of ways to dive into God's Word.

Dive into His Word and then speak with Him personally (we call it prayer). So much has happened for us to be able to have access to God the Father through Jesus Christ. Make use of the blessing of prayer. Ask Him your difficult questions. Tell Him your fears and frustrations. He can handle it. And then go back to Scripture. Read. Meditate on the words. Pray.

Whan asked, "Why is it so difficult to hear God's voice?" The answer may be as simple as this: because everything else around us is just too loud! Meaning: our lives are filled with lots of noise and distractions. Social media updates, incoming texts, TV shows, video games, extra-curricular school/work events, sporting events, etc. Though staying entertained and busy are not necessarily bad things, we can often lose our focus on God's voice in our lives.

I realize that not every verse in the Bible is going to hit you as a powerful Word from God for you today. So, when I am struggling with a certain issue, there are Bible verses that I may not read . . . like some in the books of Numbers or Leviticus. But, there are plenty of Scriptures that are right on and address my struggle. Go to these portions of Scripture and hear God speaking to you. In this way you fulfill Jesus command to "Remain in me, as I also remain in you." John 15:4.
